We all have a role to play and help the United Nations to restore and protect life below water by the year 2030. This is not an easy task and in order to achieve it, we need to start now. This holiday homework is a conscious step to understand our role and adopt practices to preserve our beautiful oceans and marine life. So let's dive in!

Activity 1 – Underwater Theatre

(a) Create your own underwater theatre! For this activity, you need to make stick puppets of any two sea animals from the help box given below:

Sea turtle, Octopus, Dolphin, Sea horse,



Starfish, Jellyfish, Blue whale



Make colorful cutouts of chosen animals and decorate them with waste paper and waste materials. Then make their stick puppets.

(b) As you know, all these beautiful creatures live inside mighty seas and oceans. They all deserve to live in clean healthy waters. The plants and animals that live inside water are important for all life on Earth. Planktons, which call our oceans their home, play a big part in keeping Earth's atmosphere healthy. They generate lot of oygen which make up the air we breathe.

A large number of people rely on fish for their food. The oils contained in some fish keep our heart healthy. But overfishing is putting the life of many sea animals in danger. Garbage is polluting the oceans making them dangerous places for fish and marine animals to live. Climate change is making the sea hotter due to which coral reefs are dying. But progress is being made to restore life below water. Keeping the Earth's oceans and waterways clean is important so that all life can thrive and live peacefully. We all have a role to play.

Keeping all the above discussed points in mind, weave a story around these sea animals. Write your story on an A4 size sheet.

Bring your story and puppets to class after summer vacations for a puppet show.

Activity 2- From the whale's mouth

One day, Edy was sitting near the seashore. Suddenly, a whale came near him who looked very worried and scared. She talked with Edy and told him about marine pollution.

(a)Read the conversation between Edy and whale.

Whale- Hello dear friend! How are you?

Edy-I am fine. What about you?

Whale- I am fine too but I am somewhat worried.

Edy- Oh! Why are you worried?

Whale- Yesterday, one of my friend turtle was swimming when he spotted a white blob floating near the surface. Chasing after it, he swallowed it. But the floating blob was not a jelly. It was a plastic bag that made my friend sick.

Edy- I am so sorry to hear this. How is your friend now?

Whale- He is better now but the plastic waste entangles us. Many fish mistakenly consume plastics as food. Young kids like you must do something to help us.

(b) After reading the conversation, prepare a poster on ways to reduce marine pollution on an A4 size sheet.

(d) After tracking how much plastic your family uses in a week, think about what you can do to use less plastic.

For example- You can eat ice-cream in a cone! Single use plastics such as ice-cream spoons account for more than 40% of plastic waste and this trash flows into the ocean. But solving this problem can be as easy as getting your sweet treat in a cone!

On an A4 size sheet, make a list of ten quick ways to reduce your plastic consumption and implement them your daily life.

Activity 3- The shark fin soup!

Some divers were diving off the coast of La Digue island ,they saw something which shook them. Read the comic strip page below to know more-



Later, these shark pieces were collected and taken to laboratory for investigation.

Researchers found out that it was the case of shark finning. It is the practice of cutting shark fins and discarding the rest of the shark at sea. The shark is often alive when tossed back into the ocean. Unable to swim, the shark slowly suffocates while sinking to the bottom.

Fact- Shark fins are used for making shark fin soup. A bowl of shark fin soup can be sold for as much as Rupees 70,000.


Activity 4- Marine Maths

(a) The life below water is an amazing place full of mysterious creatures with different shapes and various patterns.

Example- Starfish is star shaped. Many sea fishes and animals like turtle have beautiful patterns on their body called tessellations.

Paste pictures of any three such sea animals and write 2-3 lines about the related shape or tessellations. Present your work on A4 size sheets.

(b) Kate went to Andaman Islands for Scuba diving with her family. Near the coral reef, she met an octopus family. They swam next to her and she played with them. She saw that the octopuses were lighter and smaller than her. She guessed that the weight of grandfather octopus was 200 grams. The weight of father and mother octopuses were 180g and 160g respectively. The weight of baby octopuses were 100g and 120g respectively. Now use these numbers to show some number facts. One is done for you.



You can add more arms to octopus to add number facts.

Make the octopus family on a colourful A4 size sheet with sea background having coral reefs.



Activity 5- Finding Nemo

(a) Have you heard the word 'fishing'? Fishing is the activity of trying to catch fishes for food and money. But humans are putting too much pressure on the ocean by doing illegal activities. To experience what a fish goes through, when it is caught and trapped, you must see this beautiful animated movie- 'Finding Nemo'. It is about a young fish Nemo who is trapped into a tank. Watch this exciting movie with your family in vacations.

(b) After watching the movie, write the character sketch of two main characters of the movie- **Nemo and Marlin. Describe their characters by writing about their attributes.** Present your work creatively on A4 size colorful sheets. (c) Do you remember seeing all the beautiful and colorful plants that lived near Nemo? Well, that beautiful place is what we call a **coral reef.** It is like the underwater version of a flower garden. The film 'Finding Nemo' captures the beauty and color of the Great Barrier Reef to photograph the reef and reef animals. Draw a picture of the Great Barrier reef using watercolors on an A4 size pastel sheet.


Activity 6- World Ocean Week



Let's Experiment!

The summer vacations will feel incomplete without some fun and exciting experiments. So let's do an experiment to create an ocean in a bottle. You will need –

- One litter transparent plastic bottle with a cap
- Baby oil or cooking oil
- Water
- Blue food colour
- Optional ingredients like glitter, sand, sea animal toys that can enter the bottle opening



How to do?

- 1. Fill the plastic bottle one third to one half full with water.
- 2. Add 2 drops of blue food colour to the water.
- 3. If you have any extra colourful items (glitter, marbles, buttons etc) add them to the coloured water.
- 4. Fill the remainder of the bottle with a cooking oil or a baby oil, leaving a couple of inches at the top. This is necessary to stimulate the rolling of waves.
- 5. Close the cap tightly and secure it by wrapping tape around it.
- 6. Now turn the bottle over and see your ocean coming to life.
